

***RHACOPHORUS BIPUNCTATUS*** (Twin-spotted Tree Frog). BANGLADESH: HABIGANJ DISTRICT: Satchari National Park (24.1166667°N, 91.4166667°E; 195–210 m elev.). 06 March 2009. Sharif A. Mukul. Verified by Guin Wogan. Digital image deposited at USDZ, Raffles Museum of Biodiversity Research, National University of Singapore (ZRC [IMG] 1.29). Taxonomy revised (see Bordoloi et al. 2007. *Zootaxa* 1653:9) since first report from country as *R. htunwini* (Chakma 2007. *Herpetol. Rev.* 38:478). First verified record for Sylhet Division (northeastern evergreen forests). Nearest population reported from Kaptai National Park, Chittagong Division, > 200 km S of present locality (Chakma 2007, *op. cit.*). Nearest extraterritorial records include Assam (Bordoloi et al. 2007, *op. cit.*; ~ 300 km N), Nagaland (Ao et al. 2003. *Zoo's Print J.* 18:1124; > 500 km NE), Manipur (Devi and Singh 2006. *J. Exp. Zool. India* 9:317–324; ~ 400 km E) in India, and Rakhine State (Wilkinson et al. 2005. *Proc. California Acad. Sci.* 56[4]:42–52; ~ 1200 km S) in Myanmar. Adult found before sunset on forested trail, ca. 1.5 km from old Dhaka-Sylhet highway, and heavily used for firewood collection by local villagers. Habitat includes several *Acacia* plantations with major undergrowth of *Phrynium*, *Lantana*, *Amomum*, *Mikania*, and *Macaranga*.
